



## The Pastor's Letter

Pope Francis has recently dedicated this Sunday as the "Sunday of the Word of God." The Sa-




cred Scriptures are part of the life-blood of every Christian. They should be part of our every day prayer and study. In fact, I would say that they should even be studied in secular schools because the Scriptures are the source for so many phrases and idioms used in everyday speech and discourse! Saint Jerome famously said, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ!"

As you know, at each Mass we have three or four readings from Sacred Scripture. But the Scriptures are the basis for so many of

the proper and ordinary prayers of the Mass and the other sacraments. A great example is the prayer the priest says before we receive Holy Communion, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb." The first part is taken from the Gospel we heard just last Sunday. The second part comes from the Book of Revelation. The people respond, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." This comes from the words of the centurion in Luke's Gospel. This short dialogue between priest and people brings to mind three separate Scripture passages. The new (ten years old now) translation of the Roman Missal makes clear many of the Scripture sources that were not as clear in the previous translation.




We are already at the end of January and in a month's time Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Season of Lent, will be here!

Jim Vlaun for the Catholic Faith Network Telethon and consider making a donation by phone or a secure donation over the internet at <u>www.cfntv.org</u>. **TEXAS APPEALS COURT ORDERS CONTINUED TREATMENT FOR GRAVELY ILL CHILD:** Fort Worth, Texas, (CNA)EWTN: A Texas appeals court ordered that a hospital continue medical treatment for Tinslee Lewis, a terminally ill child in Fort Worth, until it rules in the case.

Tinslee was born prematurely February 1, 2019 and has since been in the cardiac intensive care unit at Cook Children's Medical Center. Physicians at the hospital believe life-sustaining treatment for her is medically inappropriate, a decision affirmed by an ethics committee. Her mother, Trinity wants treatment to continue and has to go to court to prevent the life-sustaining treatment from being withdrawn. A judge acting for the Tarrant County district court ruled January 1, 2020 that indefinite medical interventions for Tinslee could be stopped, in accord with the Texas Advanced Directives Act. The child has Ebstein's anomaly, a congenital heart defect; chronic lung disease; and severe chronic high blood pressure according to the AP. She has been on a ventilator since July, and also requires cardiac support, painkillers, sedation and medical paralysis. The rule says the physician is to make a reasonable effort to transfer the patient in such a case to a physician who is willing to comply with the directive.

At a December hearing, Judge Sandee Bryan Marion said she would allow more time for an alternative facility to be found for the child's care. Bishop Michael Olson of Fort Worth has offered to assist the child's family in seeking compassionate and appropriate care for her in a Catholic health care facility. He said on January 2. that "HEALTHCARE DECISIONS INVOLVING THE VULNERABLE AND SEVERELY ILL ARE BEST MADE IN THE PATIENT'S INTERESTS BY FAMILY AND HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS AND NOT BY JUDGES, BY POLITICIANS, OR LOBBYISTS.

**PLANNED PARENTHOOD ANNOUNCES HIGHEST ELECTION SPENDING IN ITS HISTORY:** Jenny Lawson, executive director of Planned Parenthood Votes, told CBS News THAT THE STAKES HAVE NEVER BEEN HIGHER. Planned Parenthood announced this week that it plans to spend \$45 MILLION DOLLARS TO SUPPORT PRO-ABORTION CANDIDATES AT THE PRESIDENTIAL, CONGRESSIONAL, AND STATE LEVELS IN THE 2020 ELECTION. The campaign entitled WE DECIDE 2020 marks the largest election spending in Planned Parenthood's history.

Lawson pointed to the upcoming Supreme Court case involving a Louisiana law requiring abortion doctors to have admitting privileges at a nearby hospital as "an indicator of the Trump Administration's intention" and they've never been so bold! The case marks the first major abortion decision that the Supreme Court will hand down since U.S. President Donald Trump's two court appointments. Abortion advocates fear it could reverse the 1973 Roe v. Wade decision that mandated legal abortion nationwide.

This commitment to abortion policies among the Democratic candidates includes widespread opposition to the Hyde Amendment an annual budget amendment since 1976 that prohibits federal tax dollars from paying for abortions, except in cases of rape, incest, or when it is deemed necessary to save the life of the mother. The Hyde Amendment has enjoyed longstanding bipartisan support, and attempts to repeal it over the years have failed.
