

The Pastor's Letter

Early last month, armed terrorists broke into Good Shepherd Seminary in Kaduna, Nigeria and kidnapped four seminarians. Three of them were ultimately released with injuries. However, Michael Nnaidi, only eighteen years old, was killed. Michael's death is the very definition of martyrdom. I bring this up because we have to understand that the time of martyrdom in the Church is not

limited to the first decades and centuries of the Church but continues to this day. More Christians died for their faith in the 20th Century than the 19 prior centuries *combined*. The first 19 years of the 21st century are continuing at that pace or perhaps even more. What does this mean? That more Christians have died for their faith in our lifetimes and over the course of the history of our parish, than in times we read about in Church histories or lives of the saints. That's a sobering thought.

But just as the times of martyrdom are not limited to the history of the Church, neither are the times of great saints. We read the lives of men and women like St. Peter, St. Paul, St. Agnes, St. Martin of Tours, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Dominic, and many others. As individuals they lived in the past, but it is still possible, and indeed required, for us to live similar lives of holiness and sanctity today. Today's Gospel reminds us of our responsibility to be salt and light to the world. Hiding our light under a bushel basket is not worthy of our vocation as one of the baptized. It's beneath the dignity of the graces we have received. As we reflect on the lives of the saints throughout the history of the Church, from the Apostles down to those who have given their lives for their faith in Christ between the time I have written these words and you are reading them, we need to always ask ourselves what God is requiring of us in this day and time--and whether we are ready to accept the call.

I will be leaving early Monday morning to attend some classes over the next two weeks and will return a week from Thursday in the late evening.







TRANSPORTATION SECRETARY VOWS TO STAMP OUT "MODERN SLAVERY" OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Washington DC, Jan. 2020 (CATHOLIC NEWS AGANCY) The Secretary of Transportation, Elaine Chao, has announced several new initiatives aimed at combatting human trafficking, vowing to stamp out use of American transport routes for this MODERN SLAVERY. "It is shocking to learn that in this day and age, something so horrible as human trafficking exists, and there are people who don't believe it. But it is happening, and it's happening in the United States, in our cities, in our suburbs, in our rural areas," said Chao at the agency's PUTTING THE BRAKES ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING summit in Washington D.C. "Our purpose today is to make a difference, and that's to make the transportation sector a more effective force against the evil that is human trafficking. Because America's roadways, railways, airways, and waterways are being used to facilitate this modern form of slavery," she said. Chao was joined by members of Congress, officials from multiple states, law enforcement personnel and leaders of the transportation industry at the U.S. Department of Transportation headquarters in Washington, D..C. She called on leaders of transportation companies - in the airline, shipping, trucking and locomotive industries to take the "Transportation Leaders" Against Human Trafficking Pledge" to train their employees.

Currently, there are commitments to train more than one million employees to fight human trafficking, according to USDOT, and Chao listed anti-trafficking initiatives already underway at the agency, with the strategies of "detection, deterrence, and disruption." More than 53,000 agency employees have received mandatory counter-trafficking training, including special instructions for bus and truck inspectors. The agency is also partnering with the Department of Homeland Security on the Blue Lighting initiative for the airline industry, providing anti-trafficking training for more than 100,000 airlines. The Department also announced an annual \$50,000 award for individuals or organizations for "innovative" solutions for combating trafficking as well as \$5.4 million in grant selections.

Rep. Chris Smith (R-NJ) who has authored the five laws combating human trafficking, drafted the INTERNATIONAL MEGAN'S LAW, named for 7 year old Megan Kanka of Hamilton, N.J. who was kidnapped, raped and murdered by a repeated sex offender in 1994. The law requires convicted child sex offenders to register with the U.S. government before traveling abroad. The government in turn notifies their destination countries, which can refuse to accept the offender. Smith also said that human trafficking is a barbaric abuse that thrives on greed, secrecy, a perverted sense of entitlement to exploit the vulnerable and an unimaginable disregard for the victims.

Let us pray along with Pope Francis for those affected by the coronavirus spreading in China and for the nation's commitment to contain and fight the epidemic. A handful of cases have been reported outside China, including Thailand, Australia, the United States and France with health authorities around the world racing to prevent a pandemic.
