

The Pastor's Getter



"Be holy, for I, the Lord, your God, am holy!" As we prepare to enter into the holy season of Lent this Wednesday, today's Scripture readings are a good starting point for coming up with a personal Lenten plan. What do each of us have to do to grow in holiness? Let's do some real self-examination and come up with one or a few real areas of our lives in which we can use some work. And then, let's formulate a real and concrete plan to make some real changes that will lead to real growth in holiness. Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount is challenging the people to do more, to make progress, to not settle for the bare minimum when it comes to the Law. "You have heard it said...but I say." Jesus doesn't take away the Law but rather tells

the people they can do more and they can do better! What are the areas or aspects of life in which you and I can do better? Are there areas in which we settle for the minimum or set a low bar? We need to strive for holiness and sanctity, not just getting by or doing enough! There is always room to grow and progress to make. Don't go into Lent with a bland, generic goal of "being a better person." Find a specific way in which you need to be better and do some real, concrete work to be better!

We can only grow in holiness relying on the love, grace, and mercy of God. Make this Lenten season a time of growth in prayer and reliance on the sacraments of the Church. Avail yourself of the sacraments and sacramentals of the Church. In particular, make a real and concrete effort to make the Sunday Mass the true source and summit of your week and your life. Remember, worshipping God at Mass each Sunday does not make you a good Catholic. It's the minimum and the essential way we live out our faith!

Remember, this season of Lent leads us to the celebration of the Paschal Triduum--the days of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. When we focus on Jesus on the Cross, whether on Good Friday, praying the Stations of the Cross on Fridays in the parish or privately, or any private meditation on the Cross, we see the visible sign of the love and mercy of God. The Cross is the "picture" of Jesus's complete and total self-giving for each of us. The cross is the definition of love. Jesus did that for you and me. Lent isn't about finding ways to condemn ourselves. Lent (and really the whole of the Christian life) is about finding ways to love more--to give more of ourselves over to God and to others. We've all fallen short of being able to love God and others *completely*. That's why he has provided us with grace and time to continue to make progress and grow in holiness and relationship with God and others. Each and every one of us is loved by God. Each and every one of us is already answering that love back to God and sharing it with others. But all of us can grow.

Please see the Ash Wednesday schedule in the bulletin and on the parish website. There will be ashes available in the Sunday sacristy *following* each Mass or Liturgy of the Word to take to the homebound. Priests will be available for confession after each Mass and Liturgy on Ash Wednesday. Remember our parish has scheduled confession times each day of the week. We also join with every parish in the Diocese of Rockville Centre, Diocese of Brooklyn, and Archdiocese of New York in having confessions the Monday of Holy Week from 3pm to 9pm.

We will pray Morning Prayer of the Church each Monday to Friday at 8:30am before the 9:00am Mass. Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Friday evenings. We will have Evenings of Prayer on the Wednesdays of Lent (we're still working out the details). There will be a night for Families on March 6, as well as a Soup Supper.

Please stay tuned to the bulletin, website, and app for other prayer, service, and social opportunities during this Holy Season. Our parish, neighboring parishes, the Diocese, as well as great resources like FORMED can help you have a fruitful Lenten season, but it only works if you put in the time and effort.



Meditations for Lent by Jacques-Bénigne Bossuet

Even three hundred years ago, believers found it difficult to sustain for forty days the proper Lenten spirit. That's why even then, countless Christians turned to the writings of Bishop Jacques-Bénigne Bossuet (1627-1704), whose great piety and simple eloquence won him renown as one of the greatest preachers of his time. From Bishop Bossuet's sermons and spiritual writings, believers drew ever greater Lenten wisdom and strength.

Now translator Christopher Blum has selected from Bishop Bossuet's voluminous works fifty brief but remarkably powerful meditations that complement the daily readings at Mass during the Lenten season, thus offering to us the perfect companion for a thoughtful and fruitful Lent.

If you read and meditate briefly on just one of them each day in Lent, I guarantee that this good French bishop's eloquence will soon have you not merely remembering the events of Christ's journey to His Crucifixion; it will have

you spiritually walking with Him on that journey, which is precisely what we are called to do in Lent!

With Bossuet, this Lent you will find yourself saying, "O Jesus! I present myself to you to make my journey in your company. O my Savior, receive your traveler! Here I am ready, holding on to nothing. Let me go with You to the Father." That's the fire that should burn in the heart of all Christians. This Lent, let Bishop Bossuet enkindle it in yours.


