



The Pastor's Letter I would like to thank everyone for their generosity and understanding regarding not using some options at Mass (Holy Communion from the chalice and exercising the Sign of Peace) out of concern for possible spread of flu and coronavirus. These two are always optional at every Mass. We will update everyone once we hear of any changes from the Diocese. We have also decided to cancel the Lenten Soup Supper and the Knights of Colum-

bus have cancelled the Pancake Breakfast for this year. With people staying home from Mass due to illness or fear of becoming ill, there is the very real possibility of loss of collection revenue, which is the main source of the funds to operate the parish. We appreciate those who mail in or drop off their envelopes because of illness or vacation. The best practice for us in the parish and for our families and community is to take simple, common sense precautions that we should always be exercising anyway: wash your hands, stay home when sick, etc.

Please consider joining us on Wednesday evenings to view Presence from FORMED. This week will view Episode 3. Next week will be a Holy Hour and the following week a Penance Service. If you have missed the first 2 episodes or you cannot attend Wednesday you may view yourself in the comfort of your own home on FORMED. See the bulletin for how to access this great resource that is FREE to all parishioners. If you are attending the next ALPHA session which began this past Wednesday you can also follow along on your own.

This weekend we will all view the 2020 Catholic Ministries Appeal video. This video, in just a few short minutes, gives a snapshot of the tremendous work done for Catholics and all residents of Long Island by the Diocese and related agencies, like Catholic Charities. As you will read in my pastor's letter which will arrive soon, the idea is not that a few parishioners give large gifts. The idea is that everyone participate, even with smaller gifts. All the money collected goes directly to fund the ministries of the Diocese and related entities. The money is used as it comes in for the purpose it was intended so there should be no worry that it is stored somewhere and can be taken away or used for other purposes.

This year we have secured a reduced goal of \$75,000. This is very achievable if every parish family participates, even with a small gift. The idea is "equal sacrifice, not equal giving." Once we hit 80% of the goal, the parish receives a 100% rebate until the goal is met. That is, Saint Martin's would get back every dollar from \$60,000 to \$75,000. There is an additional rebate when we go over goal. That is \$15,000 of non-budgeted income that can go a long way here at the parish. Please give serious consideration and prayer to your participation. It's a great way to fulfill your Lenten obligation of almsgiving.

Please keep in your prayers our 8th graders who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation from Bishop Richard Henning this Thursday, the Solemnity of Saint Joseph.

Third Sunday of Lent



The Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God (*Opus Dei*), is the daily prayer of the Church, marking the hours of each day and sanctifying the day with prayer. The Hours are a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ, using scripture and prayer.

Everyone is invited to pray every weekday during Lent beginning Monday March 2nd at 8:30 a.m. prior to the 9 a.m. Mass.

Vatican City, Mar 3, 2020 Pope Francis appointed Spanish-born Idente Missionary Fr. Luis Miguel Romero to be an auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, New York.

The bishop-elect is a priest of the Institute Id of Christ the Redeemer religious congregation and has had pastoral and academic assignments around the world.

Since 2014, Romero, 65, has been pastor of Our Lady of Loretto parish in Hempstead, New York. He was recently appointed vicar of Hispanic ministry and evangelization for the Diocese of Rock-ville Centre.



"I receive this appointment, believing that only grace can realize the keys that I received in my vocation: to live and transmit the Gospel with the sacrifice of my life and my reputation, faithful to the greatest testimony of love, to give up my life together with Christ for our Heavenly Father," Romero said March 3.

Bishop John O. Barres will ordain Bishop-elect Romero on April 16, 2020 at 2 p.m. at Saint Agnes Cathedral. Bishop William Murphy, Bishop-emeritus and Bishop Robert Brennan, Bishop of Columbus, Ohio, will be co-consecrating bishops.

"The Diocese of Rockville Centre rejoices in Pope Francis' appointment of Father Luis Miguel Romero as auxiliary bishop," said Bishop Barres. "I wish to express my deepest thanks to the Holy Father for this outstanding appointment to help pastor this, the eighth largest diocese in the nation. With a humble spirit, Bishop-elect Romero is a true intellectual with the 'smell of the sheep'. He is a global churchman who lives the Idente Missionary charism in an inspirational way."



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE YOU VISIT OUR FACILITIES: If you believe you or your family members may have been in contact with an individual diagnosed with COVID-19, the illness caused by the coronavirus, please call your health care provider or to alert them of this potential exposure. In addition, if you have flu-like symptoms (fever, headache, cough, muscle aches and joint pain), also call your health care provider first for instructions. If you are unable to reach your provider or don't have one, call the **New York State coronavirus hotline** with questions or concerns about travel and symptoms at **1-888-364-3065.** Testing is currently coordinated through city, county and state health departments. Any suspected COVID-19 cases will be reported to local health departments, which determine whether a patient needs to be tested. The tests are then submitted to the CDC laboratory or approved outside labs.

Please know that New York State has directed all insurance carriers to cover the cost of testing for coronavirus without copays. Testing is done through swabbing the nose and throat and sending it to an authorized lab. Although there isn't a vaccine yet, the immediate health risk remains low. You are at far greater risk of contracting the seasonal flu than COVID-19 at this time. If you haven't received the flu vaccine yet, do so as soon as possible. **The best way to avoid getting sick is to WASH YOUR HANDS for more than 30 SECONDS, clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe and avoid close contact with sick people.**

CHS's Executive Vice President and Chief Clinical Officer Patrick M. O'Shaughnessy said the health system is following precautionary guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) regarding coronavirus. CHS is prepared and has implemented prevention and control protocols to appropriately isolate patients who enter our facilities to prevent the potential transmission of infection and protect you. All clinical personnel are educated on the latest CDC and New York State Department of Health coronavirus guidelines and recommendations.

"At all CHS hospitals emergency departments, in our skilled nursing facilities and throughout our regional nursing service, we are actively screening, asking patients about recent travel and looking for signs and symptoms of the virus. Symptoms include FEVER and RESPIRATORY ISSUES." "Also, we are taking these precautionary steps at our own physician practices." Screening guidelines have been built into CHS's electronic health record (Epic), with a link to the CDC website, ensuring personnel are current on these guidelines, as updates can change on a daily basis. Training and preparation around the emerging coronavirus threat have ben implemented across the system.

Further, CHS has a COVID-19 system-wide executive operational task force that meets regularly to ensure current and continued capability to meet all CDC guidelines, including clinical protocols and travel alerts. The CDC recommends several measures people can take to prevent the spread of coronavirus: Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 30 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Stay home when you are sick. Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

It is important to note that surgical masks are only indicated for individuals who have contracted coronavirus and are not an effective deterrent against infection. Those who have had close contact with a person known to have coronavirus or have recently traveled from an area with an ongoing spread of coronavirus and feel sick should seek medical care.
