The Pastor's Letter

W

elcome back! We are glad to begin this next phase of opening back up our parish following the crisis of the last three months. While we are still not there yet, this is a major step forward. Thank you to everyone for your prayers for one another and seeing to the needs of one another. These three months showed that while our parish, and any parish, is centered around the one altar and one font of the parish church, it extends through the parish boundaries and beyond. While Mass and the other sacraments have only been celebrated on a limited basis in our church for the last three months, they have continuously been celebrated throughout this whole time and our parish church has always been unlocked for private prayer before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.



I thank everyone in advance for cooperating with our restrictions as we transition back to public worship. We are limited to 25% capacity in the church (and other buildings if we use them for worship). That means our limit in the church is about 100 people. We have closed off two out of every three rows. Individual seats are not marked out, as family members who live together would still sit together. We ask that all individuals and family groupings sit 6 feet from the next individual or family grouping. Because of our capacity limits, we have added an additional Saturday 5pm Mass and Sunday 12 noon Mass in the school. Once capacity is met or Mass begins, anyone else arriving will be directed by the ushers to the school (either the auditorium or the cafeteria). We have set up both for use and will decide based on numbers received on our reservation system).

Simply choose from the available Masses, enter your name and the number who will attend, and register. You will receive a confirmation email. Save the email on your phone or print it to bring with you. On the confirmation email you will see a link to "cancel registration." If you cannot attend a Mass for which you registered, please cancel so that the spots open up for another parishioner.

A few other notes for Mass in the coming weeks:

- There will be no processions before or after Mass and not during the offertory.
- There will be no missalettes or other worship materials provided.
- *During this time only* please consider using one of the many free resources available for your smartphones. The parish app has a button that will bring you to prayers and readings for Mass.
- Please feel free to bring your own hand Missal, Magnificat, or printed resources from home. *But remember to take anything home with you.* This makes things easier on our cleaning staff so that they can prepare for the following Mass.

In some ways, our temporary Mass procedures could be thought of as an airplane allowing passengers to exit orderly, be cleaned and "turned around," and then the next group of passengers board for the next flight. God-willing, this will all be over sooner than later!

The biggest difference you will notice is that Holy Communion will be distributed *after Mass*. Following the Blessing and Dismissal, the priest will remove his chasuble, sanitize his hands, and bring the Blessed Sacrament to the altar. Following the normal response, "Lord, I am not worthy..." you will be invited forward in an orderly fashion by the ushers to the usual "Communion Stations." You have the option to receive in the hand or on the tongue. A kneeler has been set up by the priest celebrant in order to make reception on the tongue easier. Low-gluten hosts, as before, will be distributed by the priest celebrant only.

It has been awhile, so please review how to properly receive Holy Communion. If you receive in the hand, please place one hand on top of the other **FLAT, WITHOUT FINGERS CURLED UP**. After receiving the host in your flat hand, pick it up with the bottom hand and place it on your tongue. Please avoid curling fingers and attempting to "grasp or clutch" the host. In my experience this is the single most common way to initiate contact with the one distributing Holy Communion. Whether receiving on the tongue by kneeling or in the hand where the hands are flat, leads to minimal contact. Should contact occur, there will be an ablution cup, purificator, and hand-sanitizer at a table next to the Communion Station. This is far from ideal, but this is where we are now.

Thank you to all who have worked hard over the last months in setting up for our outdoor Masses, streamed Masses, internet and communications, financial support, and all the other ways we come together and work for each other here at SMT!

This weekend the nation observes Father's Day. As part of our thanksgiving for the fathers in our lives, there will be a blessing for all fathers before the Final Blessing and Dismissal. We will also pray our Nine Day Novena of Masses for Father's Day. It is not too late to enroll your loved ones (living and deceased). Please return the special envelope (or any envelope) clearly indicating the names in the collection, in the mail, or to the parish office. We are sorry but due to the closing of the Office as well as vendors, we had a very limited supply of Mother's Day and Father's Day cards available.

And now a word about the bulletin. We have been receiving a limited supply of printed bulletins as Masses have been cancelled. The supply should increase slightly as we go forward but it will be much less than normal. Until we reach that point (and possibly going forward for cost and environmental reasons), if you can read the bulletin on the website or app, please do so and leave the paper copies for those with limited electronic access. Bulletins will only be available on the way out of Mass until supplies run out.

Please as always, stay tuned to the Parish App, website, and Facebook for the latest news. This is an ever-changing environment and those are the ways to find the latest changes. We are working on a new parish website with some great features. Stay tuned!

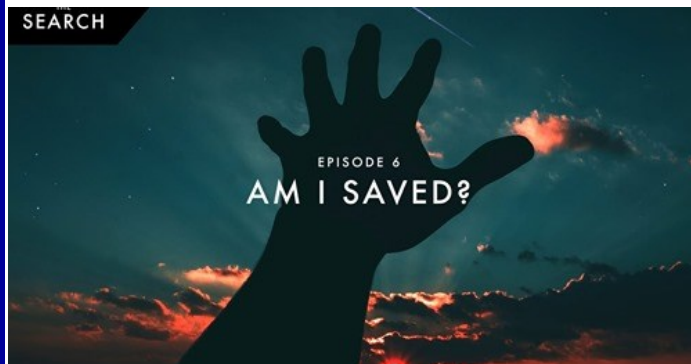
