

The Pastor's Letter



he Gospel today presents us with a great challenge: to love Jesus more than even mother, father, family, or even your very life! Discipleship is a choice that cannot be taken lightly. Jesus did not call part-time disciples. We are constantly being asked the question Jesus asked Saint Peter, "Who do you say that I am?" Our answer is not just once at baptism or confirmation, or when we renew our baptismal promises at Easter or when we are a sponsor,

or even each Sunday when we profess the Creed. No, our response is each day and every moment. Have we been living our life as if Jesus was the center? Do we love anything, or anyone more than Jesus Christ?

Today's Second Reading from the Letter to the Romans would have been the first New Testament reading to begin the Easter Season two months ago. Each year this is the Epistle reading that follows the Gloria and begins the "Mass" of the Easter Vigil. It's connected with Easter because of the connec-

tion of our baptism with the Lord's Death and Resurrection. That's why it is often proclaimed at funeral Masses as well.

Our baptism makes us part of something greater than ourselves. We are joined to the Christ's Mystical Body here on earth in preparation for joining the Church Triumphant in Heaven. These last few months we may have been physically distant from each other. But we can never be separated from the Body of Christ once baptized. We can never be separated from Jesus. In fact, in our sufferings (and we have had a lot of them this year, as individuals, families, nation, and world) we have not been abandoned by Christ but have joined more fully in His sufferings. We were indeed buried with Christ so that we have the hope of being raised with Christ.



"Are you not aware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" "...think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus."

Last weekend we were finally able to celebrate the Sunday Eucharist as the Mystical Body physically present around our parish altar. Thank you to all who helped with the many details that needed to be attended to as we follow new guidelines. We are currently capped at 25% of our capacity. We still had room at each of the Masses last weekend. Beginning this weekend we have decided not to schedule the additional 5pm and 12pm Masses in the school. We will keep both the auditorium and the cafeteria set up for Mass if needed.

By using the reservation system, we will know in advance if there is a possible need for an overflow Mass at a particular time on a particular weekend. You can go to the reservation site by clicking the link (https://pastorstoolbox.com/save-a-seat/ede6e591-a5e0-57aa-af37-6448103e2de4).

The Saturday 5pm Mass has been our most attended Mass. If possible might you consider attending one of the other Masses in order to balance out the assembly between the five Masses? You can see the number of seats reserved and available at each Mass in real time on the reservation website. For the next month daily Masses will be Monday to Friday at 9am. We will likely bring back the Saturday 9am Mass in August and the Monday to Friday 6:30am Mass following Labor Day.

We are still waiting for guidance on First Communion, Confirmation, and Religious Education for 2020 -21. It is likely that registration will not begin until August. Much depends on how the schools (both Catholic and government) operate in the Fall.

Tomorrow at 2pm Bishop-Elect Luis Romero will be ordained as an auxiliary bishop for the Diocese of Rockville Centre. The Mass is at 2pm from Saint Agnes Cathedral and may be viewed on the Catholic Faith Network. We await word on the ordination of Ronald Lacsa to the diaconate!

Simply choose from the available Masses, enter your name and the number who will attend, and register. You will receive a confirmation email. Save the email on your phone or print it to bring with you. On the confirmation email you will see a link to "cancel registration." If you cannot attend a Mass for which you registered, please cancel so that the spots open up for another parishioner.

A few other notes for Mass in the coming weeks:

- There will be no processions before or after Mass and not during the offertory.
- There will be no missalettes or other worship materials provided.
- During this time only please consider using one of the many free resources available for your smartphones. The parish app has a button that will bring you to prayers and readings for Mass.
- Please feel free to bring your own hand Missal, Magnificat, or printed resources from home. But remember to take anything home with you. This makes things easier on our cleaning staff so that they can prepare for the following Mass.



une 29th is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. These two saints are celebrated on the same day because Jesus founded his church on Saint Peter, and Saint Paul was the greatest evangelist in the history of the church. These two saints were very different from each other. Each of the two Apostles had a different mission, but together they built up the church that Jesus Christ founded. We owe our Christian faith in a large part due to them. We have personally benefited from their efforts, so it is very fitting that we honor them together.

Jesus was certainly aware of how his Father conveys knowledge to people sometimes, that they have no way of knowing on their own. In today's gospel, it seems like Jesus already knew that Peter knew, who he really was, even if he had never specifically told him. He asked the Apostles, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" It's also possible Jesus was just asking a simple question, but when Saint Peter answered Jesus, his heart was filled with the Holy Spirit. The words he spoke was simple, but came from his heart, and his words touched Jesus's own heart.



Saint Peter said, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus knew that no human person had revealed this to him, but only his Father in heaven. It makes you wonder if this was God's way of showing Jesus which Apostle loved him the most. Jesus founded his church on love. Love still guides the church and love is not necessarily found in education, structure, formation, planning, or any other human endeavor that is only conducted only with the human mind. Love without works is useless, but works without love is also useless.

he church recognizes the truth in Saint Paul's words, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." And he certainly did. Saint Paul tirelessly gave his life for Christ right up until the last moments of his life. That is all that any of us can ever really hope for as well. Hopefully, we too will make it to the "finish line" with our faith still intact and look back at our life with little regrets. Sometimes we are so busy in life that we never really think about the big picture. Do you ever wonder if you are putting your life to good use for the Lord and for those you love and the people in your community too? We still have time to make some adjustments to our goals in life, if we need to.

The scriptures today clearly show us, that God is the one in charge of our lives, not man. It's best to look to Saint Peter and Saint Paul as our own role models, and allow God to reveal His will to us, in His own time and in His own way, in any situation that we are struggling with. That was one thing Peter and Paul were good at. Listening to God's voice, and acting on it.

COLLECT PRAYER

Grant, we pray, O Lord our God, that we may be sustained by the intercession of the blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, that, as through them you gave your Church the foundations of her heavenly office, so through them you may help her to eternal salvation. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen

POPE FRANCIS ASSURES AMERICANS AND US BISHOPS OF HIS PRAYERS DURING UNREST

VATICAN NEWS: Pope Francis called Archbishop José Gomez, president of the US Bishops' Conference, with a message of solidarity and encouragement amid protests in the US sparked by the death of George Floyd. Pope Francis expressed his prayers and closeness to the Church and people of the United States. His call came amid widespread protests following the death of George Floyd. The Holy Father said he was praying for Archbishop Bernard A. Hibda and the Church of St. Paul and Minneapolis where Mr. Floyd was killed.

During the weekly General Audience on Wednesday, Pope Francis condemned all forms of racism and exclusion. He prayed for the repose of the soul of Mr. Floyd and all those who have lost their lives as a result of the sin of racism. The Pope also expressed his concern for the disturbing instances of violence that have sprung up during protests in cities across America. Quoting Archbishop Gomez, the Holy Father stressed that "NOTHING IS GAINED BY VIOLENCE AND SO MUCH IS LOST." He prayed for the consolation of the grieving families, and enjoined everyone to work towards national reconciliation and peace.

AFTER ST. JUNIPERO SERRA STATUE IS TORN DOWN, SAN FRANCISCO ARCHBISHOP SAYS PROTESTS BEING "HIJACKED" BY VIOLENCE. CNA:EWTN Catholic News Agency

After the toppling of a saint's statue in San Francisco, Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone said Saturday, June 20th that important protests over racial injustice have been "hijacked" by a mob bent on violence. "What is happening to our society?" A renewed national movement to heal memories and correct the injustices of racism and police brutality in our country has been hijacked by some into a movement of violence, looting and vandalism."

The Archbishop's statement came after a statue of St. Junipero Serra was torn down in San Francisco's Golden Gate Park, along with statues of Francis Scott Key and Ulysses S. Grant. The memorialization of historic figures merits an honest and fair discussion as to how and to whom such honor should be given. But here, there was no such rational discussion; it was mob rule, a troubling phenomenon that seems to be repeating itself throughout the country."

Archbishop Cordileone emphasized the importance of calls for racial justice and an end to police brutality, which began after the May 25 death of George Floyd, a black man killed by a Minneapolis police officer who kneeled on Floyd's neck for nearly 9 minutes. "Everyone who works for justice and equality joins in the outrage of those who have been and continue to be oppressed," the archbishop said.
