The Pastor's Letter



Today at the 10am Mass we are very happy to celebrate the sacraments of initiation with three of our fellow disciples. Jake Geller will be baptized into the Catholic faith, be confirmed, and receive the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Jordyn Geller will be confirmed and receive the Eucharist. Stacey Rapacki will be received into the Holy Catholic Church, confirmed, and receive Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We congratulate them for taking these important steps in their faith lives. Together with the sponsors we pray and support them as they grow in living the faith as disciples of the Lord. Thank you to Anne Hughes and

her team for all you do, especially during this most unusual year!

If you, or someone in your family, has not completed your sacraments of initiation, (baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist), please let us know! If you, or someone in your family, was married outside of the Church, please let us know as well so you can receive the sacrament of matrimony (and all of the graces it provides for living marriage in this difficult time).

This is a good time to provide a brief reminder about the requirements for sponsors (godparents). Please contact us if you are unsure of the requirements BEFORE you ask someone! This will avoid any awkward or difficult conversations with someone who does not meet the requirements! Sponsors must be fully initiated Catholics (baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist), 16 years of age, live a life in harmony with the faith, and have no impediments that would prevent the person from being a sponsor (such as a marriage outside the Church). Sponsors have a specific sacramental and canonical role. Being a "good person" is not enough. For more information, you can see the Diocesan Sponsor Testimonial Form here https://www.drvc-faith.org/wp-content/uploads/2016/03/Baptism-and-Confirmation-Sponsor-Information-Sponsor-Information-2-29-16.pdf. This is the form used by all parishes in the Diocese of Rockville Centre. A potential sponsor is to fill out this form with the proper information and bring it to *his or her own parish* (not the parish of the baptism or confirmation unless it is the same parish). The sponsor signs the form testifying before God and the parish representative that he or she meets the requirements. The pastor

or representative then signs as notary.

This Saturday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The obligation to attend Mass remains suspended, but we continue to celebrate the entirety of the liturgical calendar. Masses will be on Friday, August 14 at 7pm and Saturday, August 15 at 9am. Throughout August and early September daily Masses are Monday through Saturday at 9am. Confessions are at 2pm in the confessionals once again. Please note there is no option for face to face confession. All are reminded of the necessity to wear a mask that *covers both mouth and nose* for the entirety of your visit to the church. Our full regular Mass and confession schedule will return the Tuesday after Labor Day.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary



Because August 15th falls on a Saturday this year, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is <u>not</u> a Holy Day of Obligation.

Nonetheless, the Mass During the Day will be celebrated at the 7PM Vigil on Friday, August 14th and at 9AM on Saturday, August 15th.

The Gospel reading is from Luke:1:39-56 which recalls a pregnant Mary traveling to see her cousin Elizabeth who is also with child - even in her old age. The moment she heard Mary's greeting, Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and cried out in a loud voice saying,

"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord, would be fulfilled."

What follows in this gospel is *The Magnificat* also known as *The Canticle of Mary* or *Mary's Song*. Listen to the Sisters of the Daughters of Mary sing this beautiful hymn from the link below. Although it is sung in Latin, meditate on the paintings, because as revealed in the eyes of Mary and Elizabeth, the exchange between the two women transcends all languages.



AN OPEN LETTER FROM PRINCIPAL VINCENT ALBRECHT, ST. EDWARD THE CONFESSOR SCHOOL

Dear Parents,

Over the past few months, I have received numerous inquiries as to how St. Edward School will reopen in the fall. I wanted to share this information with you, knowing that as the guidelines come forth from the Governor and plans emerge from the local school districts, you may want to consider all the options available to you and your child(ren). I'd be happy to discuss this with you at any time.

For the 2020-2021 school year, St. Edward the Confessor is planning to offer five-day instruction to all our students from grades K-8 with three options:

- Full instruction in school for Early Childhood, Elementary & Middle School
- Hybrid instruction in school and via Google Classroom and Google Meet
- Full Remote instruction at home via Google Classroom and Google Meet

Under St. Edward's Reopening Plan, parents will be able to choose the instruction best suited for their needs and concerns. The complete education of every one of our students - and the safety & wellbeing of our students, faculty, and staff - remain our priority!

I believe that our plan will allow St. Edward's to offer an enriching experience, one that addresses the academic, social, emotional, and spiritual needs of all our students. The plan has also been designed to offer flexibility, with the understanding that there may be times during the course of the 2020-2021 school year that students need to participate in remote instruction.

Our Reopening Plan is the result of months of discussion, research, and planning. In order to create a safe Reopening Plan, compliant with New York State Department of Health guidelines and recommendations set forth by the Governor and Diocese of Rockville Centre, St. Edward the Confessor School convened a task force including healthcare and other professionals, educators and advisors, and parents and students. In addition, we contracted the services of Perrotta Consulting LLC to review and supplement our Plan, and have implemented their recommendations. (Perrotta Consulting specializes in threat mitigation and emergency operation planning.)

There are many components of reopening that the task force has addressed including: implementation of a three-part educational plan (in school, hybrid, remote); class size; -transparent barriers in offices and classrooms; use of face masks; creation of hand sanitizing stations; reconfiguration of traffic patterns both in the building and at drop off/pick up; further integration of Chromebooks and iPads in everyday learning; use of Google Classroom; creation of an isolation room; specific guidelines for entering the building; outdoor learning; purchase of supplies and equipment; and physical education.

Our complete Reopening Plan is available on our website at www.stedwardconfessor.org I know these are uncertain times.

FORMED FOR ADULTS CONVINCED: Why Would Anyone Become Catholic?

respect-love-protect Many times as consultants, we are not aware of what our words and prayers have accomplished. More often than not, it is truly a team effort. Sophia* was

a young mom with a 1-year-old and found herself with what she considered an untimely pregnancy. She had been coming to the Life Center for a couple of years for her first pregnancy test kit and following the birth of her son. What transpires in the Life Center visits is a trusting relationship that enhances a confident spirit between the client and the consultants. In a six-month span during Sophia's second pregnancy, she was abortion vulnerable, undecided. As she met with another consultant for baby items for her son, she left that visit with a positive pregnancy test and an appointment for a sonogram at the Gianna Center, yet her situation was very much unresolved.

In three months, Sophia returned for another visit for her son with a different consultant and was still undecided at this time. It's very troubling for the team as we know the outcome if she were to go through an abortion. We believe each consultant has a word of wisdom for the client. As we consider the journey of the client, we can see that more and more of her story was being unveiled, like the peeling of an onion. There was betrayal, abuse, and now single parenting of two children on the horizon. All that we can do is continue to talk and pray about the gift of life and the support she would be receiving throughout her pregnancy.

Prayer is key, and through COVID-19 and the minimal volunteers available, the staff at the Life Center has continued to rely on one another at each center to ask for prayer in difficult cases, such as this one. Our volunteers are vital to this mission, and yet as always, God provided during this untimely pandemic. Another three months passed with some communication with the client but no confirmation of a decision in either direction. Our guess was Sophia was struggling.

Then, the call came through. She would need more items for her new baby to be born in a few days! I can't really say we worry too much at the Life Center about not having enough baby items. We have seen it time and time again that we can be cleared out of an item a new mom needs, and then miraculously, what was needed is now fulfilled with God's providence through generous donations from so many different directions! The donations did not stop throughout the lockdown crisis.



The stress and anxiety shuts down a woman's initiative to provide even the most basic needs for her children.
