

### The Pastor's Letter



We began scheduling First Communion and Confirmation using our parish Mass Reservation System (https://pastorstoolbox.com/save-a-seat/ede6e591-a5e0-57aa-af37-6448103e2de4) this past Thursday. Beginning tomorrow morning, August 17, you may contact the Faith Formation Office with any requests for First Communion or Confirmation at weekend or weekday Masses. Permission must be sought from the Bishop for Confirmation so plans must be made in advance of the date and last-minute changes will not be possible.

We are currently working on our Faith Formation Program for this coming year. It will not begin until after First Communion and Confirmation have been completed. There are still many details to work out. However, I can say that it will not be the previous program based on a one hour a week classroom session. The focus of the new program will be the Sunday Eucharist and living the faith as a Catholic family. Once we have the details worked out, we will advertise for registration.

We are hoping to have registration completely online this year. Our new website will be launched in the coming weeks. We have also acquired software from the makers of our Parish App that will be able to instantly send out messages to email, text, app, Facebook, twitter, etc. at the preference of the parishioner. It will greatly improve our communication. In order for us to send information, we need to know where to send it! As part of the our new website and technology efforts, we will be making a push for everyone in the parish to enter their information, especially email! We learned during the Covid shutdown that much of our information is outdated or incorrect. Many people have changed addresses, phone numbers, and even email addresses since they registered with the parish. Remember, many of you last provided registration information years ago! The new system will enable us to communicate regularly and effectively. Of course, we will still publish the bulletin. But the bulletin is published by the middle of the week and, as we have seen over these months, developments happen between Wednesday and Sunday.

As I am writing this our sound system is being upgraded and overhauled. Hopefully you experienced the improvement before you read these words! In addition to fixing some problems and upgrading discontinued equipment, we have added wireless capability and the ability to transmit sound digitally to cameras or recorders. This will enhance our ability to record or perhaps stream liturgies from the church. If you remember back on Palm Sunday we streamed Mass from the church but the sound was not good. This will eliminate that problem. This was all done thanks to your generosity in the previous capital campaign!

Until we are able to have an offertory procession again, the collection will be taken up as you enter or leave the church. There are locked boxes by the main doors. Should there be two collections, each box will be clearly marked. Thanks again for your continued stewardship of your parish.

### Bishop's letter: Catholic faith shows the danger of 'mediums'

Bishop John Barres has released a new letter to the faithful of the Diocese of Rockville Centre addressing the dangerous practice of using "mediums" to communicate with the dead, saying "while the desire to connect with the dead and find hope in loss may seem perfectly Christian, the practices condemned by our faith actually corrupt those good desires and lead us further away from God."

In the letter, released August 12 the Bishop says, "As Christians we believe the soul lives on even after the body dies.... We cling to the belief that we and those we love are not subject to eternal nothingness. But human nature always seeks assurance, and an increasingly popular supposed path to such assurance is recourse to mediums."

"On television and the internet we see countless mediums who travel far and wide claiming to connect the bereaved with

loved ones on the "other side." Some have reached a celebrity status, with waitlists extending out years and drawing thousands of people to their live shows. Knowing things they seemingly should not know, they are able to persuade an audience member that they are speaking to the departed, sharing messages of comfort, forgiveness, and encouragement."

"At times, they even announce that they are practicing Catholics and, understandably, this strikes many as a beautiful work of faith, bringing solace to the sorrowful," writes Bishop Barres, adding that "the dangers of these practices are not obvious, making them all the more perilous."

"We can speak of two hidden dangers associated with any form of divination, but especially with consulting mediums: first, the practices attempt to circumvent God; second, to put it plainly, if frighteningly, in doing so they open one to demonic influence." ### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

One of the "behind the scenes" ministries is the Altar Society, and one of their jobs is caring for purificators\* that are used at all Masses.

\*Purificators are folded in thirds and placed over the chalice and under the paten. These small linens are the most frequently laundered of all the linens in liturgical use. Purificators are used to clean out the chalice and paten after communion.

allows you to watch Mass on TV or online. While this is not ideal, it is an option to keep you and everyone else safe.



These are trying times. We have faced a global pandemic, lost loved ones, and had our way of life changed, maybe for a long time to come. We now wear face masks to prevent the spread of this virus, We space ourselves from others, especially loved ones if we are vulnerable. Many of us have lost our jobs, are anxious about meeting our obligations, and for a time, our churches were closed.

When we found our way through COVID-19, protests against the police began by the senseless death of George Floyd. Protesting lead to some rioting, and our cities have come under siege. Protesters standing up with their message, have been threatened by the violent atmosphere around them. And so, freedom of speech and protest is being threatened.

Now we face the aftermath of Hurricane Isaias. Somewhere in the range of 500,000 of us lost all power, in a heat wave that produced temperatures exceeding 90 degrees or more. Trees came down taking with them power and cable lines, closed streets and left us in darkness. Some of us were forced to leave our homes to live with others and worry about the spread of COVID. Those who needed oxygen or life saving electrical devices, were left to go to the E.R. or for some, to shelters.

These are times of great stress and anxiety. Many of us who are still living without power, or are unable to go home, need our prayers and concern. We need to reach out to them to help in any way we can. Pope Francis has these words for us: EVEN IN TIMES OF DARKNESS, GOD IS THERE!

**CNA: EWTN:** Vatican City, Aug. 9, 2020. "When caught in difficult moments or trials, turn your heart to God, who is near even when you do not search for Him," Pope Francis said in his Angelus address Sunday. "Having faith means, in the midst of the storm, keeping your heart turned to God, to His love, to His tenderness as a Father. Jesus wanted to teach this to Peter and his disciples, and also to us today, in moments of darkness, moments of storms," the pope said.

"Perhaps we, in the dark, cry out: 'Lord! Lord!' thinking that He is far away. And He says: "I'm here! Ah, he was with me!" "God knows well that our faith is poor and that our path can be troubled, blocked by adverse forces. But He is the Risen One, do not forget this, the Lord who went through death to bring us to safety."

"In hose situations, the Church may be tempted to think that God has abandoned her, but in reality, it is precisely in those moments that the witness of faith, the testimony of love and the testimony of hope shines the most," he said. "When we feel strong doubt and fear and we seem to sink, in the difficult moments of life, where everything becomes dark, we must not be ashamed to cry out, like Peter: "Lord, save me!"` excerpts from CNA https://www.catholicnewsagency.com

Have you ever heard the word, "Unexpected?" In case you haven't, something that is unexpected is something that is a surprise. For example, you might be planning something fun on a sunny day, but suddenly it rained once you got outside, that would be unexpected. I wanted to share this word of "unexpected" with you because in today's scripture story, Jesus does some things I think most of us find to be unexpected.

The story begins with a woman asking Jesus to heal her daughter. Instead of saying "Yes" or "No," Jesus ignores her, which is the first unexpected thing that he does. Then, when she keeps asking him for help, he tells her that he can't because there are other people he is supposed to help instead. This is a very unexpected thing for Jesus to say. And I am sure the woman did not expect this answer from Jesus, either. But, guess what? The woman did not give up. Instead, she gave Jesus so many reasons why he should help her. And you know what? Jesus decides to help her and her sick child! He knew that her believing in him was more powerful than the people he was supposed to help. By the time she got home, her daughter was completely healed!

This story is important because the woman doesn't give up. It doesn't matter what unexpected things happen, she just keeps asking for help. And eventually that help is offered to her. I think this story is told because it helps us think about what happens when we ask God for help. We might expect certain things to happen when we ask for help in prayer. But unexpected things might happen instead. Those unexpected things might make us feel like we should just quit asking God for help. But what we see in today's gospel is a reminder that when unexpected things happen after asking for help, that we should *keep* asking for help, *keep* praying to God. God hears our prayers and knows what is best for us, even if those answers are not what we expected.
