his weekend we welcome Fr. Dermot Roach, SMA of the Society of African Missions. The SMA Fathers were founded by Venerable Bishop Melchior Marion de Bressilac of France in 1856, with the specific charge by Pope Pius IX for the establishment and development of the Church in Africa. As a result of their work, and many other missionary orders, Africa is among the most vibrant and fastest growing local churches in the world. lope clearly marked "Mission Appeal." All Catholics have an obligation to support the missions by our resources and by our prayers.

We are in the process of preparing for the celebrations of First Holy Communion and Confirmation that were postponed from this spring. These sacraments will be celebrated during September and the first week of October. Previous bulletins, app messages, and emails provided the registration information. If you have still not registered for a liturgy, or wish to receive the sacrament at a weekday or weekend liturgy, please contact the Faith Formation Office directly by emailing Pat Ryan or Laura Leigh Agnese (pryan@smtbethpage.org. llagnese@smtbethpage.org). Specific information about the liturgies, including any rehearsal information, will be provided at a later date. <u>Registration information for the coming Fall will be provided at a later date once all details have been worked out.</u> I apologize to all who were not able to access the registration website in a timely manner last week.

As we prepare for Faith Formation this coming year, I would ask all parents to reflect on the promise they made before God and the Church on the day of their child's baptism. At the beginning of the rite, after stating the name given to their child, parents were asked this question (emphasis added):

You have asked to have *your* child baptized. In doing so *you* are accepting the responsibility of training him (her) in the practice of the faith. It will be *your duty* to bring him (her) up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor. *Do you clearly understand* what you are undertaking? PARENTS: *We do.*

The goal of our, and any, faith formation program is to assist parents with this promise. Parents are, and always should be, the first educators of their children in the faith. Parents have a natural right to see to their children's education in general. In a society where this role is increasing being taken over by the state, the Church does and always will emphasize and protect the natural rights of parents and the family.

Our maintenance staff regularly sanitizes the church with a hospital-grade disinfectant. However, each of us have a part to play in keeping our beautiful church clean. We can do that by using common sense and very basic practices. If the church building is "clean," and each of us come in "clean," then it should remain clean. How do we do this? First and foremost, please wear your mask. Even if you don't think the mask works, please don't be the reason your fellow parishioner does not feel safe coming to Mass!

Second, come in with clean hands! Please bring a small sanitizer and clean your hands before you come in. If you are wearing gloves, please sanitize your hands and put on a new, clean pair of gloves after you enter the church! Wearing gloves into the church that you have used all day is the same as having dirty hands. Remember, you cannot receive Holy Communion in a gloved hand.

The bathroom will be unlocked but should only used in emergencies. Mass is roughly one hour. This is half the time of a normal movie and about the average length of a drive from here to the George Washington Bridge in traffic. Of course, the bathroom is there if we really need it, but if we can regularly get through a movie or a drive without using it, we should consider that for Mass as well.

If each of us does our small part we can ensure there are no complications and we return to "normal" as soon as possible. Thank you for your continued patience, understanding, and generosity.

Remember, we're all in this together!



CDC REPORT FINDS ONE IN FOUR YOUNG ADULTS CONTEMPLATE SUICIDE: Washington D.C. News-room, (CNA) Catholic News Agency, EWTN: Aug. 14, 2020:

Over a quarter of young adults aged 18 - 24 have seriously contemplated suicide over the last month, a new Centers for Disease Control survey has found. The report titled MENTAL HEALTH, SUBSTANCE USE and SUICIDAL IDEATION DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC - UN.S., June 24 - 30 2020 was published on August 14. The data was collected from adults across the United States in late June. Tommy Tighe, a marriage and family counselor and host of the Catholic mental health podcast SAINT DYMPHNA'S PLAY-BOOK, told CNA that he found the data to be "really heartbreaking, though expected."

After months of extended lockdowns across the country, and anxieties about the coronavirus pandemic, Tighe said, "our baseline level of anxiety has gone up during this experience. Trying to live with this higher baseline has certainly impacted our ability to tolerate frustration and stress." According to the CDC, 40.9% of respondents reported at least one adverse mental or behavioral health condition, including symptoms of anxiety disorder or depressive disorder 30.9% symptoms of a trauma-and-stressor-related disorder related to the pandemic, 26.3% and having started or increased substance use to cope with stress or emotions related to COVID-19 13.3%.

Of all respondents, 10.7% reported "having seriously considered suicide" in the 30 days prior to taking the survey. "Mental health symptoms and healthy coping skills to combat those symptoms are ignored by our culture at large, and thus many of us are left utterly unprepared for dealing with an experience of this magnitude." During the pandemic, schools of all levels throughout the country closed to in-person instruction. For graduating seniors at colleges and universities - most of whom are in the 18 - 24 age group, this meant that their final semester of college was spend online. Many students had their jobs or internships canceled due to the unstable economic effects of the pandemic. This would cause significant mental/emotional distress. They may feel their lives are on hold or delayed, and do not know when they can resume their lives.

Sophia Swinford, the founder of Catholic Mental Health, a nonprofit organization aiming to increase awareness and access to mental health resources for Catholics, told CNA that she is concerned that the stigma surrounding suicide prevents people, particularly those of a religious faith, from getting help. People need to reach out to one another during this time. "We need to talk to each other and see how people are doing. We live in a time when we have technology to be a consistent contact with each other. People need to pray for each other. Taking a break from media and other settings that heighten anxiety is also important." excerpts taken from CNA: August 14.

Much of what we see and hear on social media is upsetting to say the least. We have been watching the course of COVID-19 effect our lives in so many ways. Our children are returning to school soon, and stress over their safety is a concern to many parents. We have just gotten past a hurricane that has left many without power and downed utility wires. We see quiet protesting, some rioting in our cities and attacks on police on a daily basis. We need to find ways to cope with these issues, and prayer and reaching out is a great way. Realizing the stress factor that this pandemic has had on most of us, and that many of our youth are not dealing with it in a healthy way, should make us reach out and find help when there are signs of depression in them.

All of the qualities of a friend are found in Jesus. We know that by reading about the life of Jesus and learning about the loving and compassionate things he did. Simon Peter knew, first hand, that Jesus was a friend because he saw how Jesus lived his life, how he offered love and helped others.

Jesus, however, is more than a friend; he is "the Son of the living God." The true identity of Jesus was made known to Simon Peter by God. As we pray and study the Bible, Jesus is revealed to us also, as more than a friend. Jesus is a friend and the Son of the living God.
